- 1. Provide additional support for community road safety initiatives and programs.

- 9. To provide and develop a link between current road safety and awareness programs through political means, encouraging organisations to provide a more connected and coherent plan for road safety education, particularly in schools.
- 10. Develop, deliver and support programs that are seen as effective, supportive, and ground-breaking, which other States and countries will seek to replicate.
- 11. Provide a totally independent outlet for the media to contact for discussions and comments regarding road awareness and other road safety matters. We want to be a constructive and independent voice regarding road safety.

PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

As a Foundation, we offer Road Safety Advice and Education to all members of our communities in both regional and metro areas, be it through delivering our **Year 10 Road Safety Program** which presents to students and their families, talking with the **senior members** of our driving community about staying safe on our roads, building a **Regional Road Safety Alliance** to make our country roads safer, promoting safe strategies for **getting home safe from sports games and clubs**, helping to create **safer systems around road works** areas, or giving general advice on road safety issues through direct presentations or interviews via media.

Current programs include;

Annual Primary School Poster competition - to encourage Under 12s to discuss road safety with their peers, teachers and families.



Started in 2018 with less than 30 entries, we now receive hundred annually from across South Australia.

Crucially, young students are starting to have conversations with each other, their teachers, and their parents about how to be safer on the roads.

Safe Mates Shield.

We are extremely proud of the impact we are having in the cricket communities. The Safe Mates Shield initiative is a proactive road safety program aimed at fostering safe and responsible cultures within sporting clubs. Initially focused on cricket communities, the project will be expanded to other sports, emphasising the importance of maintaining road safety mindsets for the benefit of the whole club community.

The initiative encourages collaboration between rival clubs to reinforce the message that creating a safe environment is a shared responsibility. By urging players, coaches, staff, and supporters to watch out for each other's wellbeing before, during, and after games and practices, the Safe Mates Shield aims to ensure that everyone gets home safe to their loved ones.







Rival SA Premier League Cricket clubs Glenelg and Port Adelaide will compete every season for the Safe Mates Shield, sponsored by Toyota Australia. The winning club each year will receive funds and mentorship to develop a road safety initiative for their club community.





This program, supported by Toyota Australia, follows on from the very impactful Get Home Safe Round initiative which encouraged all Premier League clubs to focus on Road Safety. Players, parents, supporters, members and club staff were reminded of the importance of using safe behaviours when using the road.

Women Against Road Toll.

Launched in Adelaide in 2018, our annual Women Against Road Toll High Tea raises awareness of the crucial role that women play regarding road safety. We want to empower women to lead their families and encourage all family



members to take road safety more seriously. Parents are the role models of our future driving generation, we need everyone to show their children how to get home safe... every time.

Our Women Against Road Toll Ambassador is Channel 7 and Smooth FM Presenter Kelly Golding. Kelly's family is all too familiar with the never ending heartache suffered by families who lose loved ones on our roads.

With plans to launch our Women Against Road Toll High Teas in Perth and Sydney in the coming years, we aim to eventually have an event in every State.







Regional Road Safety Alliance (RRSA).

This is a new approach to regional road safety that we aim to eventually implement in regions across SA and Australia.

The issue;

Over two thirds of deaths on Australian roads occur in regional locations. Volunteer Regional Road Safety Groups have struggled in recent years, with the majority of these groups folding.

Direct support to the groups has been limited.

Our aims and objectives;

We aim to engage directly with all stakeholders including Emergency Services, Councils, businesses and local residents. It's the local people that know the local issues.

The Alliance will build a culture of collaboration. Solutions found to be successful in one town can be applied to other towns.

By working as a collective, more ideas, more solutions and better outcomes across the regions will be achieved.

Local people will have more ownership regarding implementation of solutions. We aim to have regional areas represented by at least (but not restricted to) one Council Member, members of the CFS / Police / Ambulance Services as well as members of the general public from across the regions.

Support;

The Get Home Safe Foundation will provide intellectual support as well as financial support as much as possible.

We aim to encourage financial support from all levels of Government as well as local Councils and businesses.

All funds gained will be injected back into community road safety.

There will be annual Alliance conferences in each region.

KEEP IT OFF THE ROAD

This initiative has been in partnership with the South Australian Government and Think! Road Safety.

Utilising all social media platforms, this campaign has been regarded as highly successful. Having gained real traction in the public domain, expiation notices and crashes have reduced in the two years that we have delivered our messages of "What happens on the track, stays on the track."



Year 10 High School Road Safety Program

There are two unique features of this ground-breaking program. The sessions feature Australia's first virtual reality driving simulator that connects to a real vehicle. Students learn in an experiential way how behaviours as drivers and passengers can shape their futures.



This is also the only school program that actively involves parents and carers. We deliver crucial messages to parents in (evening sessions at the schools) regarding road rules, how to choose Instructors, choosing safer cars and how to be better role models when using the roads.

This program has been recognised at International Road Safety conferences, State Parliament and at Federal Parliament House, Canberra.

Bike Safety - Let's all go Dutch.



In partnership with the Amy Gillett Foundation, we developed a program that would help to create a new generation of drivers who will look out for cyclists.

Our stickers to promote the education of the "Dutch Reach" and also stickers for side mirrors reminding drivers and passengers to look for cyclists when entering or leaving the car are now being used by the South Australian Driver Training industry.

Global Partnerships

Having been delayed by COVID, our connections with road safety organisations overseas will regain momentum in the near future.

Navigating the Road Ahead – Documentary.

"Navigating The Road Ahead" will explore the complex issue of older drivers, focusing on their vulnerabilities, the factors contributing to crashes and the critical decisions that need to be made regarding the time to stop driving.

The Importance of This Documentary:

The subject of older drivers is one that affects everyone. Whether we are aging drivers ourselves, have senior relatives or simply share the roads with those who are elderly, this issue impacts on all our lives.

This documentary will touch on the crucial questions surrounding senior drivers, including:

- What medical and physical capabilities deteriorate with age, impacting driving ability?
- How can we tell when it's time for someone to hand in their license?
- Who makes the final decision regarding a driver's fitness to drive?
- Should there be specific legislation governing age limits for drivers?
- What are the emotional and practical challenges that families face when asking a loved one to stop driving?
- What support is available for drivers transitioning from driving to relying on alternative transportation options?

Overall Objectives:

- **Raise Awareness:** Highlight the increasing risk posed by aging drivers, not only to themselves but to other road users.
- **Provide Education:** Offer insights from experts, medical professionals, driving instructors and road safety officials on the signs of both deteriorating driving skills and medical issues that will affect safe driving.
- **Offer Solutions:** Give practical advice for senior drivers, their families and caregivers on how to address the difficult conversation of giving up a driver's license and explore alternative transportation options.
- **Support Senior Drivers and Families:** Showcase real-life stories from senior drivers undergoing medical assessments or those who have had to give up their license, giving an empathetic perspective on the emotional and logistical challenges they face.

This project is in the production planning stage. The finished product will be utilised as an educational piece as well as being a crucial source of support for families across Australia and overseas.

This is real life. No gimmicks and no self promotion. Utilising experts from the medical, research and road safety field, we aim to help everyone to navigate the road ahead at a difficult time for almost every family.

With future partnerships and funding we will develop;

Sports Club Accreditation

Sports clubs of all codes have inherent issues regarding driver behaviours such as drink driving.

Partnerships with sporting and Government organisations will enable us to implement an accreditation system that will reward clubs that undertake our program. The accreditation will require promotion of good driving choices, looking after your mates, transport systems to avoid driving after drinking and the creation of a safe driving culture that clubs will be proud of.



Emergency vehicle – What's your response?

We have a planned partnership with SA Ambulance to develop a series of educational videos that will teach drivers how to respond to emergency vehicles. Delayed by COVID, development of this program is now at the development stage.



Work zones - we all want to get home safe.



In collaboration with Workzone Traffic Control, one of the leading traffic management companies in the country, we aim to set a new benchmark for safety in roadwork zones. With several significant projects upcoming in South Australia, our efforts involve close cooperation with all key stakeholders, including the South Australian Government. Our goal is to ensure the utmost safety for road workers, traffic controllers, and the general public during these potentially hazardous operations.
